

The 1st October 1928.

Under the provisions of rule 7 of the Rules for the regulation of sports in reserved forests, published under Notification No. 1344R., dated the 26th March 1915, as amended by Notification No. 305SR., dated the 4th September 1916 and Forest Department Notification of the 2nd November 1928, the following reserves are declared, with the previous approval of the Governor in Council, to be sanctuaries in which hunting, shooting or trapping is altogether prohibited, except under special permits to be granted by the Conservator of Forests, Western Circle, Assam, to approved sportsmen for the exclusive purpose of hunting and killing carnivorous animals.

Fishing in these sanctuaries may be permitted under rule 5 of the aforesaid Rules with the previous sanction of the Conservator of Forests, Western Circle, Assam :—

Goalpara ...	Portion of Ripu Reserved Forests.	North.—The district boundary from the Sankos to the Ranga or Jakati river. East.—The Ranga or Jakati river from the district boundary to the north boundary of the Kachugaon reserve. South.—The north boundary of the Kachugaon reserve from the Ranga or Jakati river to the Sankos river. West.—The east bank of the Sankos river from the northern boundary of the Kachugaon reserve to the district boundary.
Ditto ...	Portion of the Ripu Reserve ...	North.—The district boundary. East.—The west bank of the Saralbhangra river. South.—The demarcated line which constitutes the south boundary of the reserve between the Hel and Saralbhangra rivers. West.—The east bank of the Hel river.
Ditto ...	Portion of the Monas Reserve...	North.—The district boundary. East.—The west bank of the Monas river. South.—The demarcated line which forms the south boundary of the reserve between the Sukanjan and the Monas rivers. West.—The east bank of the Sukanjan river.
Kamrup ...	The North Kamrup Reserve ...	North.—The Bhutan boundary from the Monas river in an easterly direction to the eastern boundary of the Bijni mauza. East.—From the Bhutan boundary down the Semajhora till it becomes the Satarpa river and thence down the Satarpa river to the point where the old <i>ali</i> or <i>bund</i> meets it. South.—A line running due south-west from the north-west corner of Kaligaon village lands to the Giati Nadi and then due west to Gohaingaon on the river Monas. West.—Up the east bank of the Monas river from Gohaingaon to the foot of the Bhutan Hills.
